

Wisconsin GI Bill Remission Request For Spring 2011

This remission cannot be applied until you have a complete file at MATC which includes a 2029 Form, required supporting documentation, approval FORM 2031 from the WDVA and this request to use your benefit. (Note: The remission request form is completed and submitted by you each semester after you have registered for your classes.)

- **Veterans/Dependents/Spouses** – * 128 credit limit (which includes credits received under the Federal Chapter 33 Post 9/11 program, credits used under the WI GI Bill at other UW System and WI State Technical College Schools) The new WI GI Bill regulations were signed into law July, 2009).
- **Dependents** - Age limit is under the age of 26. (128 credit limit applies to dependents also—see above*.)
- **Spouses** - Current marital status, residency requirement, death and disability rating date determination and dependent children are factors in applying the remission. (128 credit limit applies to Spouses also – see above*.)

Check the appropriate boxes below. Sign, date and submit this form to our office AFTER you have registered for your classes.

- I am registered for my classes for Spring 2011 and am requesting to use my WI GI Bill Remission for the Spring 2011 term.**
- I certify that I am NOT eligible to receive benefits under the New Post 911/Chapter 33 Federal Montgomery GI Bill Program. I may be asked to submit a denial letter from the U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs regarding this new benefit before this remission can be applied.
 - It has been determined that my eligibility under the Chapter 33/Post 911 program is less than 100% and/or I have 12 months or less of federal military benefit remaining. I am eligible for the WI GI Bill Remission supplement from the State of Wisconsin. I have enclosed (or have previously submitted) a copy of my Web Automated Verification of Enrollment (WAVE) report or most current federal VA award letter showing months used and months remaining for Chapter 30, 35, 1606, or 1607 benefits and/or New Certificate of Eligibility for Chapter 33/Post 911.

By signing this form I confirm that I understand that the WI GI Bill remission waiver covers tuition and material fees only. (Note: Per the WI GI Bill Handbook WDVA B0105, the remission covers only academic, college-credit courses.) All other non-academic courses, non college-credit courses, district fees (Academic Support Center, Student Activity, and Graduation), transportation surcharge, on-line course fees, ID charges, books, uniforms, etc are **not covered by the Wisconsin GI Bill Remission. I also understand that these charges are my responsibility.**

It is suggested that unless you have applied and have been awarded financial aid that you go on the installment plan so you are not dropped for non-payment of these charges during the drop period. It may take up to two to four weeks after you turn in your form to apply your remission to your account, especially during peak processing periods.
