## PROGRAM SUMMARY

### QUALIFICATIONS

The National Technical Honor Society is a nonprofit organization for outstanding students enrolled in diploma or associate degree, occupational or technical programs. The organization was founded in 1984 in Grambling, South Carolina, by a diverse group of business, community and education leaders, including two-year college directors, instructors and students, who continue to serve the organization on its national board. The organization has chapters throughout the United States and is proud to include Milwaukee Area Technical College on its ever-growing list of charter colleges.

### ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

**to join the National Technical Honor Society are as follows:**

- Associate degree students who have completed at least 24 credits of study (8 of which may be transfer credits), or technical diploma students who have completed at least 12 credits of study;
- These credits must have been earned in an occupational program;
- The student must have a 3.5 cumulative grade-point average;
- In addition, students who wish to join the society must describe an experience related to their current program of study, which occurred during the past five years. This experience must be either:
  - a non-paying position such as a clinical or internship experience, membership in an MATC student organization or community/fraternal/professional organization, **or**
  - a paid position.

Each semester, students eligible for membership in the society will be contacted and offered the opportunity to join the society. Students will be given an opportunity for full membership in the society based on their academic achievements and whether they meet the additional requirements noted. Induction ceremonies are then conducted for those students who meet the criteria for eligibility and complete the membership application.
