REFRIGERATION, AIR CONDITIONING AND HEATING SERVICE TECHNICIAN

Oak Creek Campus

The curriculum provides instruction in all types of air conditioning and refrigeration equipment, including room air conditioners, ice cube makers, and display freezer and refrigeration units. The operation, repair and installation of gas-and oil-fired heating units also are taught. Students receive Technical Diploma upon successful completion.

About

Dual Enrollment Academy (DEA) participants receive college-level training to begin careers in high-demand fields. Throughout their senior year, DEA students earn high school and college credits while spending the majority of their school day at MATC. The DEA is designed for students attending high schools within MATC's district.

Student Eligibility Requirements

- Be a 2026-27 high school senior
- · Have a counselor recommendation
- Have a high school GPA of 2.0 or higher
- Be in good academic standing and on track to graduate from high school
- Have 90% attendance record in high school (exceptions made for illness)
- Have completed Algebra II with a minimum grade of C
