

Wisconsin GI Bill Remission Request Fall 2022

(NOTE: REMISSION REQUEST FORM must be completed, signed and submitted by you EACH semester AFTER you have registered for your classes.)

This remission cannot be applied unless you have a complete file at MATC which includes a 2029 Form, required supporting documentation, approval FORM 2031 from the WDVA and this request to use your benefit.

- See WDVA website for complete WI GI Bill Remission regulations including 128 credit limit For Veterans/Dependents/Spouses.
- Dependents – Age limit is under the age of 26.
- Spouses – Current marital status, residency requirement, death and disability rating date determination and dependent children are factors in applying the remission.

STEP 1 Check the box of the category that pertains to you:

- Veteran Spouse Dependent (Child)

STEP 2 Check one of the next two boxes that pertain to you:

- I certify that I am NOT eligible to receive benefits under the New Post 911/Chapter 33 Federal Montgomery GI Bill Program. (If I am a veteran I may be asked to submit a denial letter from the U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs regarding this new benefit before this remission can be applied.)
- It has been determined that my eligibility under the Chapter 33/Post 911 program is **either** less than 100% **and/or** I have 12 months or less of federal military benefit remaining. (I have enclosed (or have previously submitted) a copy of my Web Automated Verification of Enrollment (WAVE) report or most current federal VA award letter showing months used and months remaining for Chapter 30, 35, 1606, or 1607 benefits and/or New Certificate of Eligibility for Chapter 33/Post 911.)

STEP 3 By signing this form I confirm that:

I UNDERSTAND that the WI GI Bill remission waiver covers tuition and material fees only. (Note: Per the WI GI Bill Handbook WDVA B0105, the remission covers only academic, college-credit courses.) All other non-academic courses, non college-credit courses, district fees (Academic Support Center, Student Activity, and Graduation), transportation surcharge, on-line course fees, ID charges, books, uniforms, etc are **not** covered by the Wisconsin GI Bill Remission.

I UNDERSTAND that it may take up to four weeks after I turn in my form before my remission is applied to my account (especially during peak processing periods). And that **unless I have applied and have been awarded financial aid that I must pay my bill in full or go on the installment plan** so that I am not dropped for non-payment of my bill during the drop period even though I am waiting for my remission to be applied to my account.

I UNDERSTAND that any charges **NOT** covered by the WI GI Bill Remission are my responsibility. **Forms must be received during the current term to receive benefits.**

Dear WI GI Bill participant:

Please be aware of the following changes to the WI GI Bill. They may affect your eligibility in using your education benefits:

As of January 1, 2014, you must have a 2.0 cumulative GPA or higher to qualify for any benefits (tuition remission or supplemental payments) under the WI GI Bill program. If your cumulative GPA is not at least 2.0, you will not qualify for tuition remissions and will be responsible for any costs associated with attending classes for the current semester/term.
