Microcomputer software or software documentation that is purchased by MATC is copyrighted and may not be reproduced by any MATC employee.

1. MATC licenses the use of its computer software from a variety of outside companies. MATC does not own this software or its related documentation and, unless authorized by the software developer, MATC does not have the right to reproduce it.
2. With regard to local area networks or on multiple machines, MATC employees shall use the software only in accordance with the license agreement.
3. MATC employees learning of any misuse of software or related documentation within MATC shall notify their immediate supervisor or MATC's legal counsel.
4. MATC employees caught making, acquiring, or using unauthorized copies of computer software will be disciplined as appropriate under the circumstances.
5. According to the U.S. Copyright Law, illegal reproduction of software can be subject to civil damages of \$50,000 or more and criminal penalties including fines and imprisonment.

All MATC microcomputer users that check out software for school-related purposes shall be required to read and sign the "Microcomputer Software Copyright Acknowledgement" letter (see reverse).
